OUTDOOR LEARNING

I am sure I'm not telling you anything you don't already know when I say, we learn through play. Even as adults this is true although the play may look a little different. I'd like to take this opportunity to again thank the P&F Committee and you as parents for your willingness to support school projects. Without this financial back up we would not be able to offer the breadth of experiences we do. This year we are concentrating on completing the outdoor projects that have been undertaken over the past two years. Now we are down to the nitty gritty, making sure children have the right equipment that enables them to engage with the outdoors. Through playing outside children learn so much, academic work is practiced – counting, language and of course social/emotional wellbeing is lived – managing themselves and interacting with others. The new mud kitchen has been a great success and the learning that has happened is outstanding. I encourage you to go and have a look at what your donations and commitment to our school is providing for our children, to enable them to flourish and be the best person they can be.

NAPLAN

The Years 3 and 5 classes took part in NAPLAN testing this week. It's important to remember that this is a snapshot of a child's learning, knowledge and ability to perform in a testing situation. Results will arrive in Term Three. A big thank you to Liz Commane who coordinates this requirement.

CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK

You would have received a flier earlier this week highlighting what we are doing to celebrate this significant week, please read it so you are up to date with what will be happening next week. Our whole school excursion will be the highpoint of our celebrations. Please note that on that day, no one will be at the school – Mary, Sheridan and Sue are coming too!!

I ask you to take a little time to think that our school/s would not be in existence today if it were not for the dedication, commitment and sacrifice of those who came before us. The Dominican Sisters struggled to begin our school many, many years ago, travelling by horse and cart, in the heat down dusty roads to ensure the children of this area were educated and cared for. Today we don't have the same struggles yet some of our issues are similar and we are proud to continue their work. On Monday 1 May Sister Anne Dolan spoke with the staff about the early days of the sisters. Her stories were heartfelt, interesting and entertaining. Anne shared a reflection with us and in part it said...."The Sisters must respect the personal dignity of the child....The teacher's function is to stimulate the child's God-given knowledge....To teach well is a great art"

As a staff we were floored by this article as although the language is outdated the sentiment is exactly the same today, 100+ years later! I'd like to express my thanks to the School Board and the school community for supporting the need for pupil free days that enable the staff time to meet, reflect and plan together.

FUNDING

I write my Newsletter piece early in the week and by now we would have had the Budget news and know the impact it will have on education. As parents who pay taxes and are citizens of South Australia, I would encourage you to keep abreast of political news and events. As I write this, the banter is not good for Catholic schools. Although we have been promised, many times, increases in funding, it is beginning to look like we may not be getting what we wished for, again! We need common funding arrangements across Australia and across all sectors of educations. No matter where a child goes to school, they should attract the same funding and parents should continue to have the choice of schooling no matter their financial circumstance. As we continue to juggle the finances of our school I thank you for your organization and preparedness to work with us on ensuring school fees are paid.



Second Hand Uniform

The second hand uniform shop is situated opposite the lift and is opened on Friday mornings between 8:30 to 9:15. The uniform shop is operated as part of P&F fund raising activities and 20% from all goods sold goes directly to the P&F with the balance going to the owner of the item sold. If families choose to donate items to the uniform shop the items may be distributed to families in need, or will be sold and 100% of the sale being donated to the P&F.

If you are unable to visit the shop on Friday mornings, clothing for donation may be left at the front office. If you would like to purchase an item but are unable to attend on Friday morning, please contact me by email or through the front office and I will check if we have what you are looking on the next Friday that the shop is open. If so I will let you know and then leave it at the Front Office.

Please note the following in regards to providing uniform for sale:

- 1. All items must be clean, in good repair and part of the current school uniform.
- 2. Items are left at owner's risk.
- 3. All items left at the front office must detail your name and address and whether they are for sale or donation.

The person responsible for the Uniform Shop will:

- 1. Determine if items are in appropriate condition for sale and return items that are not saleable.
- 2. Determine the best sale price, taking into consideration, condition and pricing of like items in store.
- 3. Record details of items, price and date received.
- 4. Record details of sales, and request payment to be forwarded to original owner by the P&F Treasurer. Please note that this will occur only several times a year.
- 5. Undertake a stock-take of items either annually at which time, items in store for longer than two years will be returned to the owner or destroyed.

There are many families looking for good quality winter uniform at the moment, particularly in sizes 8 to 12 so if you have anything that no longer fits, please think about selling or donating it to the Second Hand Uniform Shop.
