

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Dear families and friends,

As I reflect on Term Three and all that has happened I am once again amazed at all that is packed into ten weeks of a school term. What a term it's been, we've had: NAPLAN, celebrated Mary MacKillop day and the Feast of the Assumption with whole school parish Masses. Musically there's been the Catholic Schools Music Festival and our All Star singing group has visited local kindies. Book Week saw everyone dressing up, Dad's spent a morning with our R/1's tinkering, classes have been on excursions, there's been sport carnivals, Outdoor Education Day highlighting sustainability, STEM and social skills. Photo Day brought out all our big smiles, classes have showed off their learning at Assemblies, teachers have had opportunities to undertake professional learning, our 2018 Reception children began their Little Ants sessions, playgroup families practiced their science skills plus much, much more. And that's just what I can think of without even opening my diary!

As a principal of only three terms experience at St Anthony's I've continued to get to know children during yard duties and random wanderings, meetings in my office (they love this!), through lunch club, assemblies, school gatherings, popping into playgroup, little ants and classrooms, my door is typically open during the day and many children wander in and out for a chat, one day last week I had around 12 children playing around me in my office as I was responding to emails – I love every minute of it!

In regards to the community: I'm getting better with parents names and knowing who belongs to who, chats at drop off and pick up are often the highlight of my day, I've joined in a car park coffee van session, I've run four tours for prospective families, I've built a relationship with some parishioners, I met with Fr Phillip and consultants from Catholic Education and I always aim to sit with staff at one break time, I've been to visit many of our local kindies and long day care centres – introducing myself and giving St Anthony's a face, I've had many meetings with our regions principals and I've had many meetings with parents, some just casual, others more formal, some positive and some more difficult. I've met with all teaching staff in regards to their work and their dreams and, I'm feeling like I've been here a long time – and I love every minute of it!

At this time of the year for me it is like living in two worlds, there's all the normal day to day running of a school that is happening here and now, while at the same time I am planning for next year. With the school staff we have begun looking at 2018, what our needs are, how we can better cater for your children and how we will make all ends meet. This is not an easy task! Next term this will get even more complicated as there are so many more school events to manage and prepare for. Please be mindful that Term Four will start with a vengeance and won't slow down and we have our School Fete which will keep us all on our toes. Be gentle on yourself and kind to each other or as 4/5SB say...be kinder than kind.

Class Placements

A blessing of a small school is that we all need to be able to work together and with each other as there are few ways to separate children. Early next term we will be formulating classes for 2018 and in many instances little will change for some children however by nature of our class structures we do have children move rooms and teachers. In some schools I've worked in this can be a very long and difficult process, I'm confident that it will be smooth in our school. I don't want this to be the cause of anxiety for any child or parent.

The children themselves are only ever focused on making sure they have a friend in their class, and class teachers have a process that enables this. I believe class teachers are the best people to make a professional judgment on which class a child should go into and which children they will work best with and I know that you will trust us to make the best decision. However as a school that consults and values highly parent input, if you have any information you believe we need to consider, could I ask you to put it in writing and hand it to the front office by the end of week one. I encourage you to focus on your child's academic needs and avoid including names of children and or teachers.

Please let me add, a way to build children's resilience is to support them through difficult times. Life has ups and downs and what better way to build our coping skills than when we are surrounded by loved ones who can hold our hand and walk the tough journey with us. If your child does begin to worry about next year, a simple, "I know you're worried but let's leave it for now" and then distract them in a way that you know will be successful. When we trust in each other and in God, things have a way of turning out just right!

Road Safety

SAPOL have sent us some road safety reminders and we will providing you with their safety tips in each newsletter for the rest of the year.

Sgt John and Humphrey say – Road Safety around Schools Begins with You



Young children are naturally inquisitive, move surprisingly fast and can run into the path of a moving vehicle without warning. We know that roads, car parks, footpaths and driveways are never safe places to play, but when we get distracted with other things, children can become bored and put themselves in harm's way. Always supervise your children and do not let them play around cars or near traffic. When they are near cars, hold their hand or hold them close to keep them safe – this includes in your own driveway. Tragically one child is accidentally run over in their own driveway every week in Australia.

Even children who seem to know all the road safety rules won't necessarily remember to follow them when something catches their attention. Take special care where there's a lot of traffic, high-speed traffic, narrow or no footpaths, or things that can block the view, such as parked cars and trucks, trees, crests of hills or crowded footpaths. You can help children develop pedestrian safety skills and road safety skills by giving them plenty of practice around real roads – for example, by walking with children to and from child care or school, around the block or to the local shops. A top tip for helping kids learn about pedestrian safety and road safety is to describe what you're doing each time, so your child can understand why it's important.



Never ignore children in traffic!

It's nice to chat with other parents but children quickly become bored with adults talking so **keep it brief** and **always hold on to little hands.**
